We are also grateful for the unstinted support and guidance of our MC members, as we continue on our journey.





FRNV's Programme

FRNV – VALUES BASED EDUCATION (VBE) PROGRAMME

FRNV's Values Based Education (VBE) aims at creating an education ecosystem in which each stakeholder decides to embark upon value based living. It identifies the values to be lived by all stakeholders and collectively co-create an environment which is conducive for such living. We believe that creation of values based society is imperative and the best way to go about doing this is by starting with schools. In the last eight years, FRNV has held discussions, debates, meetings and seminars and developed a strategy for Values Based Education System. We are now ready to roll this strategy out in the schools and communities, as well as hold dialogues to influence the policy makers.

This year, we have identified and reached out to three Government Schools, one Government –Aided School and one private School, Shri Ram School, this year to pilot our VBE programme. A field study was carried out in Shri Ram School - Gurugram and Dehradun branches to ascertain the efficacy of existing value education programme of the school.

We have developed *Self Assessment Index* for students and teachers to understand their existing Values.

We have also developed a set of indicators to test the success of our programme, which will be put to test before and after the intervention.

Beginning January 2017, we will also identify and start pilot in four government schools of Haryana.

FRNV – POLICE REFORMS PROGRAMME

FRNV's Police Reforms programme aims at creating a disciplined and ethical police service, rather than a "Force".

In May this year, we conducted a survey of 29 states and seven Union Territories to ascertain the status of Police Complaints Authority (PCA) in the country. The survey revealed that PCA is still in nascent stages, even after ten years of Supreme Court (SC) guideline mandating the setting up of PCA. Our survey shows that only six states and four UTs have created a proper channel for victims to file complaints against police personnel through PCAs.

In the next few years we will work on awareness generation regarding PCAs and do evidence based advocacy for the implementation of SC guidelines.

FRNV – CORPORATE TRAINING WORKSHOP

Two training workshops were held this year, in April and October, for corporate executives to help them in playing an active role in creating systems that uphold ethical behaviour and integrity in their enterprises.

Speakers from different corporate houses as well as the Government spoke to the participants on the importance of personal commitment to values, and the benefits of adhering to ethical standards in the conduct of business.

We are planning to conduct in-house training programmes for companies, starting next year.




FRNV – RESPONSE TO OUR LETTERS AND PILS FROM PROF P. J. KURIEN, DEPUTY CHAIR, RAJYA SABHA

In response to FRNV's PILs and letter seeking unobstructed functioning of the Parliament, Prof P J Kurien, Deputy Chair of Rajya Sabha wrote to us that obstruction of the Parliamentary proceedings is not expected of Members of Parliament, however, sometimes Members feel 'compelled to raise issues of urgent public importance in ways deemed proper by them'.

A new Chapter at Karnataka was opened in September this year. The office of this chapter is located at Bengaluru and is headed by Shri V.Vishwanath.




